Required Trainings

If conducting human subjects research at the University of Maryland, Baltimore (UMB) you are required to complete Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI) and Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) trainings. If you do not complete and maintain appropriate certifications of required trainings you will be noncompliant with UMB IRB policies and the IRB will not review your submission.

<u>CITI Training (required every three years)</u> - All individuals engaged in human participant research at UMB are required to complete the UMB-specific CITI training.

All individuals are required to complete either:

Group 1: Biomedical Research Investigators and Key Personnel or

Group 2: Social/Behavioral Research Investigators and Key Personnel

You should complete the module that is most aligned with the type of research you conduct. For example:

<u>Social/Behavioral Research (SBR)</u>: This is most appropriate for researchers who specialize in the social and behavioral sciences. Data collection methods commonly include surveys, interviews, focus groups, observations, and other non-invasive measures. SBR tends to focus on attitudes, beliefs, and behaviors.

<u>Biomedical:</u> This is most appropriate for researchers involved in clinical drug or device trials or other biomedical research. Biomedical studies include studies on human physiology or the treatment or understanding of the disease. However, not all biomedical studies include the administration of a drug or use of a device.

<u>HIPAA Training (required once)</u> - University of Maryland, Baltimore policy requires that all individuals complete **HIPAA 125**, regardless of whether they are engaging in research. All individuals engaging in research must also complete **HIPAA 201**.

<u>Environmental Health and Safety Training (EHS)</u> - All employees that work in a laboratory are required to take laboratory safety training. New employees that work in a laboratory must take the classroom course prior to working in a laboratory. All employees that work in a laboratory must take the online laboratory safety training on an annual basis. Employees with potential exposure to bloodborne pathogens must take the bloodborne pathogens training annually.

Employees that work with radioactive material must take radiation safety training. Radiation safety training is only offered in a classroom setting. Employees that ship biological material must take the Department of Transportation (DOT) Infectious and Biological Material Shipping. Employees can take either the online or the classroom version.
