

## Resources for Networking and Sharing in Your Local Community

Do you need help finding which store in your local community has toilet paper available? Are you willing and able to help a neighbor in need pick up groceries or supplies safely? Various community-based resources allow you to register with your specific neighborhood to network and share information with those nearby. Both Facebook and Nextdoor have launched new tools to increase connections during the COVID-19 pandemic.   - Neighborhood social networking app Nextdoor has introduced two new features, **Help Maps** and **Groups**, to give people a way to support one another during the coronavirus outbreak. The **Help Map** offers a way to coordinate aid between those in need and those willing to offer some form of assistance. **Groups** allows smaller groups to network outside of the main feed.

  - Helping Hands is a nonprofit organization dedicated to serving those most vulnerable to COVID-19: senior citizens, the immunocompromised, and people with pre-existing medical conditions which put them at additional risk. The Helping Hands platform can work anywhere in the United States, so long as there are volunteers signed up and requests being made.
