KAREN DOYLE, DNP '20, MS '91, MBA, BSN '85, RN, NEA-BC, FAAN

With over 35 years of nursing experience, Karen Doyle, DNP '20, MS '91, MBA, BSN '85, RN, NEA-BC, FAAN, has served in a variety of executive roles in trauma and emergency nursing as well as women's and surgical services. She currently serves as the Senior Vice President of Nursing and Operations at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center and Care Management at the University of Maryland Medical Center (UMMC) in Baltimore. The Cowley Shock Trauma Center is the nation's first integrated trauma hospital and is one of the largest trauma treatment and research centers in the United States.

Doyle's transformational leadership style and business acumen have been instrumental in the success of several key initiatives, including the expansion of the trauma/critical care/emergency service; the successful Nurse Magnet application for UMMC; the relocation and building of a 250-bed, acute-care hospital; and the development of a surgery/obstetric/gynecologic hospitalist program.

Doyle received her Doctor of Nursing Practice from the University of Maryland School of Nursing and her MBA from Loyola University Maryland in Baltimore. She is a graduate of the Class of 2010 Greater Baltimore Leadership and a 2011 Weinberg Foundation Mission Scholar. She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing. She is also a board member at University of Maryland Rehabilitation and Orthopedic Institute and Mount Washington Pediatric Hospital Center and Vice Chair of the State Emergency Services Advisory Council.

In addition to her clinical and administrative responsibilities, she serves as an Adjunct Assistant Professor at the UMSON.
