STEPHAN DAVIS, DNP, MHSA, BSN '07, NEA-BC, CENP, CPHQ, CNE, FACHE

Stephan Davis, DNP, MHSA, BSN '07, NEA-BC, CENP, CPHQ, CNE, FACHE, serves as an assistant professor, director of the Master of Health Administration program, and chair of the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion committee at The University of North Texas Health Science Center (HSC) School of Public Health. Since joining HSC in 2020, he has led the program to achieve significant growth and has facilitated program enhancements and innovations, such as the launch of its Executives in Residence program. Under his leadership, the program has become the first MHA in the nation to fully integrate a pathway to Certified Professional in Healthcare Quality Designation through a unique partnership with the National Association for Healthcare Quality.



He is a fellow and faculty member of the American College of Healthcare Executives (ACHE) and serves as regent-at-large for ACHE District Four, a role created to promote diversity in ACHE's governance. In addition, he serves as chair of the Quality and Safety Faculty Forum for the Association of University Programs in Health Administration (AUPHA) and presented a video-based simulation on discrimination in clinical practice environments at the AUPHA conference in 2021. Davis served as an invited conferee at the 2020 Macy Foundation Conference, Addressing Harmful Bias and Eliminating Discrimination in Health Professions Learning Environments, which culminated in a report of recommendations and action steps to advance DEI in health professions learning environments.

In addition to being a proud alumnus of the University of Maryland School of Nursing's Bachelor of Science in Nursing program, he earned his Doctor of Nursing Practice in Healthcare Leadership, Systems, and Policy from Yale University and holds a master's degree in health systems administration from Georgetown University.
