Distinguished Speaker

RONNIE USRIN, DNP, MS '07, MBA, BSN '05, RN, NEA-BC, FACHE

New Orleans native Ronnie Ursin, DNP, MS '07, MBA, BSN '05, RN, NEA-BC, FACHE, is the chief nurse executive at Natchitoches Regional Medical Center, a 96-bed, acute-care, full-service hospital in Natchitoches, Louisiana. He has been a nurse for 17 years, 15 of which include nursing leadership. Ursin's clinical experience includes medical-surgical and cardiac, medical, and surgical intensive care. He has functioned in multiple leadership capacities, from department manager to president and CEO of a hospital. Ursin is certified as a nurse executive and a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives.

He entered the nursing profession after serving as a high school mathematics teacher in Louisiana. He holds an Associate Degree in Nursing from the Los Angeles Trade Technical College; a Bachelor of Science in Public Health from Dillard University in New Orleans; a Bachelor of Science in Nursing, a Master of Science – Health Services Leadership and Management, and a post-master's Certificate in Teaching in Nursing and Health Professions from the University of Maryland School of Nursing; a Master of Business Administration from Hood College in Frederick, Maryland; and a Doctor of Nursing Practice from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio.

Ursin has served as adjunct faculty at the University of Maryland, Baltimore and several other institutions and is currently an adjunct assistant professor at the University of Maryland Global Campus in the Health Services Management program.

He has made a significant impact on the health care community as a board member, editor-in-chief, manuscript reviewer, and program evaluator, among other roles, for several national organizations and publications, including the National Black Nurses Association. He is the treasurer for the Association of Black Nursing Faculty and the organization's foundation.
