UMSON Dean's Medal for Distinguished Service

Mary Etta Mills, ScD, RN, NEA-BC, FAAN

In 2017, Jane M. Kirschling, PhD, RN, FAAN, then the Bill and Joanne Conway Dean of the University of Maryland School of Nursing, established the Dean's Medal for Distinguished Service to recognize individuals, external to the institution, who have demonstrated "an exceptional commitment to advancing the University of Maryland School of Nursing and its mission." That year, the inaugural recipients of the Dean's Medal, Bill and Joanne Conway, were recognized for extraordinary support for nursing education through the Conway Scholars Program.

Mills joined the School of Nursing in 1988 as an associate professor and was promoted to professor in 2005. She



retired in June 2022 after a distinguished career, during which she held numerous academic leadership positions, including chair of the Department of Education, Administration, Health Policy, and Informatics and associate dean for academic affairs. She also served as interim dean of the School of Nursing from September 2019 - January 2020.

Her research, teaching, and professional activities included extensive work in the areas of health services, quality of care, patient safety, and nursing informatics. As a visionary leader on behalf of the School of Nursing, she developed the first master's program in nursing informatics in the nation in 1998 and the first doctoral program in nursing informatics in the world in 1991. She continues to provide leadership for the School's nationally and internationally recognized Summer Institute in Nursing Informatics.

Her interdisciplinary research and training grants have focused on developing the field of nursing informatics education and application and on advancing the field of health services administration and education through strategic academicservice partnerships throughout Maryland. She has mentored a generation of doctorally prepared nurses, and her former students have gone on to make significant contributions to nursing, serving as deans, associate deans, chief nursing officers, chief information officers, and policy and organizational leaders.

As a member of the Maryland Health Resources Planning Commission for 14 years, Mills served as chair of the Certificate of Need Committee and participated in the development of the Maryland State Health Plan. She also served as a representative to the Healthcare Access and Cost Commission, working on issues of health information privacy and confidentiality. As a member of the Governor's Task Force on the Electronic Health Record, she contributed to the development of standards for the Statewide Electronic Health Record.

Her international work in health services and informatics provided educational direction for the Canadian Health Services Center, the Pan American Health Organization, the Saudi Arabian Health Services, and several Taiwanese universities.

Mills was elected as a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing in 2001. She has been recognized with numerous awards, including the Distinguished Alumni award from the University of Maryland School of Nursing and the University of Maryland Medical Center's University of Maryland School of Nursing Leadership Excellence Colleague Award.

We honor her for her significant contributions to the School of Nursing and her advancement of the nursing profession at the state, national, and global levels.

UMB Honorary Degree Recipient

Shirley Nathan-Pulliam, DPS, DHL, MAS, RN, FAAN, Honorary Doctor of Public Service

Nominations for honorary degrees must be approved by the Board of Regents of the University System of Maryland, upon the recommendation of the Board's Committee on Education Policy and Student Life. Recipients must be individuals who have made exceptional contributions in intellectual, scholarly, or creative areas; who have risen to a position of eminence in their chosen field or acquired a national or international reputation in a selected field or endeavor; or who have compiled a record of distinguished public service.

Nathan-Pulliam has had a profound impact on health care in Maryland. Keenly aware of the problems with access and quality of care, she has been a leading advocate for improved health care for underserved populations and for addressing health care disparities.



A dedicated public servant, Nathan-Pulliam served in the Maryland House of Delegates for 20 years, from 1994 - 2014, and subsequently in the Maryland State Senate for five years, until her retirement in late 2019.

Her initiatives as a legislator included funding for breast cancer diagnosis and treatment, an oral cancer mortality reduction program, and treatment for co-occurring disorders of substance use and mental illness. She sponsored legislation creating the Healthcare Disparities Prevention Act and establishing the Maryland Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities. She successfully led efforts to require education in cultural competency for health care professionals. There is virtually no area of state health care policy and legislation that was not touched by her during her tenure in the Legislature.

Throughout her career, she maintained her active license as a registered nurse in Maryland and leveraged her nursing education and knowledge and her roots in nursing practice to inform policy development. She has received more than 30 awards and honors during the course of her career and was recognized as one of the School of Nursing's inaugural Visionary Pioneers on the occasion of its 125th anniversary.

Nathan-Pulliam has served the people of Maryland and the nursing profession with an abiding commitment to ensuring the delivery of just and equitable health care for all by advancing numerous health policy initiatives, working to reduce health care disparities and inequities, and striving to strengthen the health care system to better serve all residents of the state.
