## **Dean's Medal for Distinguished Service 2018**

Lisa Rowen, DNSc, RN, CENP, FAAN, Chief Nurse Executive, University of Maryland Medical System, and Senior Vice President for Patient Care Services and Chief Nursing Officer, University of Maryland Medical Center

In 2017, Dean Jane Kirschling established the Dean's Medal for Distinguished Service to recognize individuals, external to the institution, who have demonstrated "an exceptional commitment to advancing the University of Maryland School of Nursing and its mission." That year, the inaugural receipients of the Dean's Medal, Bill and Joanne Conway, were recognized for extraordinary support for nusing education through the Conway Scholars Program.

Dr. Rowen's contributions as a nurse leader are well known. In 2015, she was recognized as a Visionary Pioneer of the School of Nursing, an award given to outstanding alumni who have significantly impacted and contributed to the nursing profession based on entrepreneurship, innovation, and leadership. As chief nurse executive for UMMS, Dr. Rowen serves as the system's leader for nursing practice, standards of care, and issues related to and of importance to nurses. As the senior vice president for patient care services and chief nursing officer at UMMC, she oversees 5,000 nurses, advanced practice nurses, and other health professionals.

In 2007, upon her arrival at UMMC, Dr. Rowen and then School of Nursing Dean Janet Allan, PhD, RN, FAAN, launched an innovative partnership between the School of Nursing and the Medical Center. Today, UMNursing continues to optimize patient outcomes by enhancing nursing education, research, and practice within both institutions at

outcomes by enhancing nursing education, research, and practice within both institutions and by fostering professional development and lifelong learning for nurses. It has become a model for collaboration between academic nursing and clinical practice nursing.

UMNursing has significantly enhanced the School of Nursing's educational programs, providing outstanding clinical opportunities for students and insight into the needs and future directions of clinical nursing. This vibrant collaboration is a testament to Dr. Rowen's ongoing leadership and unwavering commitment to creating an authentic partnership that benefits the patients, families, and communities that we all serve.



An acronym for Diseases Attacking the Immune SYstem, The DAISY Foundation was formed in November 1999, by the family of J. Patrick Barnes, who died at age 33 of complications of Idiopathic Thrombocytopenic Purpura. The nursing care Patrick received when hospitalized profoundly touched his family. Cynthia Sweeney, MSN, BSN '76, RN, CNOR, NEA-BC, serves as executive director of the foundation.

#### DAISY AWARD FOR EXTRAORDINARY NURSING FACULTY

This award honors those who inspire their students to remember that nursing is much more than tasks and technology. These faculty help ensure that the art as well as the science of nursing are brought to every patient experience.

Debra L. Wiegand, PhD, RN, CCRN, CHPN, FAHA, FPCN, FAAN, Former Associate Professor (awarded posthumously)

With a clinical background in cardiac critical care nursing, Dr. Wiegand taught palliative care, end-of-life, and bioethics courses. Her research focused on improving care provided to families of patients with acute and chronic life-limiting illnesses, studying family-focused interventions to facilitate the physical and psychosocial adaptation of families both during

the dying process and after their loved one's death. Dr. Wiegand generated research that also illuminated intensive care unit nurses' experiences of providing care to individuals near death and their families and the toll such care takes on nurses. In addition to her positions in academia and clinical practice, she contributed to the field through her leadership in national and international organizations related to family nursing, hospice and palliative care, critical care, and heart disease. Dr. Wiegand passed away on Nov. 13, 2018.

## University System of Maryland Wilson H. Elkins Professorship: Louise Jenkins, PhD, RN, FAHA, ANEF

Louise S. Jenkins, PhD, RN, FAHA, ANEF, a professor and the cofounder and director of UMSON's Institute for Educators, was awarded a 2018-19 Wilson H. Elkins Professorship from the University System of Maryland (USM) for her work in developing a comprehensive blueprint for preparing the next generation of nursing faculty in the state. Her development plan includes creating a think tank of experts in teaching and learning, expanding pilot projects, and engaging with faculty throughout the state. The award amount is \$50,000.


