Develop a comprehensive plan for the socialization of BSN students to graduate study .

Develop a student research-training laboratory with resources and technology to aid in the requisite skill attainment for the doctoral prepared Advance Practice nurse. Develop initiatives and strategies for retention of students that leverages the use of various modalities.
