Objectives

VISION - Provide path for newly licensed nurse to enter the nursing workforce in the ambulatory care environment:


- Develop a framework for a student nurse transition-topractice (SNTTP) within the current university-school partnership that enhances understanding of the role and key activities of the ambulatory nurse.
- Offer a pre-licensure clinical practicum rotation in ambulatory nursing. (Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) /Clinical Nurse Leader (CNL) 4th semester).
- Identify learning needs and implement ambulatory nurse preceptor training to prepare them for their role in supporting the student nurse throughout the experience.
