

### BSN Prerequisite Course List Instructions

1. Before you begin, read this page carefully to avoid mistakes that will prevent your application from being reviewed.
2. Complete the prerequisite course list in its entirety; incomplete forms won't be accepted.

## Eligibility Requirements

All courses listed on page 2 and 3 will need to be complete before enrollment, but only the courses in column 2 below need to be completed in order to apply.

At the application deadline, ensure the following:

## Final Grades, Transcripts, and Test Scores

**Official, final transcripts** must be submitted upon completion of any coursework in progress.

*Failure to submit transcripts from all schools attended will disqualify your admission.*

**Official AP or CLEP scores** are required if used for prerequisite credit.

**Final transcripts and scores must be submitted one week prior to classes starting.**

## Prerequisite Requirements

All prerequisite courses must be completed prior to enrollment at UMSO.

have <b>not</b> earned a bachelor's degree	complete all 59 prerequisites
have earned a bachelor's degree	complete only the courses in <b>bold</b>

**IMPORTANT**- Admitted students must provide proof of enrollment for any outstanding prerequisite courses. Submit documentation by June 1 for students admitted for fall and Sept. 1 for students admitted for spring. Acceptable documentation includes an official transcript, unofficial transcript, or a letter from the registrar's office stating that you are enrolled in the courses. Failure to provide documentation of coursework in progress may result in the cancellation of your admission.

## General Notes

- Online courses are acceptable.
- No course can be used to fulfill more than one requirement.
- List any repeated courses on the final page of the form.

English <i>Comp 1</i> (3 credits)					<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Introductory-level English and one higher-level course fulfills this requirement</li> <li>• English as a second language is not accepted</li> </ul>
English II <i>Comp 2 or Creative Writing/Literature</i> (3 credits)
