## Final Grades, Transcripts, and Test Scores

**Official, final transcripts** must be submitted upon completion of any coursework in progress.

*Failure to submit transcripts from all schools attended will make you ineligible for admission.*

**Official AP or CLEP scores** must be submitted if being used for prerequisite credit.
