

#### RN-to-BSN Prerequisite Course List Instructions

- 1. Before you begin, read this page carefully to avoid mistakes that will prevent your application from being reviewed.
- 2. Complete pages 2-3 in entirety; incomplete forms will not be accepted.

## **Eligibility Requirements**

All courses listed on page 2 and 3 will need to be complete before enrollment, but only the courses in column 2 below need to be completed in order to apply.

At the application deadline, ensure the following:

#### **Final Grades, Transcripts, and Test Scores**

**Official, final transcripts** must be submitted upon completion of any coursework in progress. Failure to submit transcripts from all schools attended will make you ineligible for admission.

Official AP or CLEP scores must be submitted if being used for prerequisite credit.

Final transcripts and scores must be one week prior to classes starting.

## **Prerequisite Requirements**

All prerequisite courses must be completed prior to enrollment at UMSON.

IMPORTANT- Admitted students must provide proof of enrollment for any outstanding prerequisite courses. Submit documentation by June 1 for students admitted for fall and Sept. 1 for students admitted for spring. Acceptable documentation includes an official transcript, unofficial transcript, or a letter from the registrar's office stating that you are enrolled in the courses. Failure to provide documentation of coursework in progress may result in the cancellation of your admission.

- No course can be used to fulfill more than one requirement.
